## History of Rabies

The origin of the word rabies is either from the Sanskrit "rabhas" (to do violence) or the Latin "rabere" (to rage). The ancient Greeks called rabies "lyssa" (violence). Today, the virus causing rabies is classified in the genus *Lyssa Virus*.

The first real treatment for rabies came in the 1880's. A French chemistry teacher named Louis Pasteur was dabbling with cholera when he noticed that virulent cultures exposed to no longer caused disease. He also noted that chickens given weakened or "attenuated strain" were immune to inoculation with fresh, virulent cultures.
